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NATIONAL MEDICAL IMAGING ANNOUNCES EHR CERTIFICATION

Cleveland, Ohio-October 31, 2011- National Medical Imaging, LLC announces that its' Electronic Health Record (EHR) suite for ambulatory care called Integrated Communication Systems (ICS) version 4.1 has received the federal government's "meaningful use" stamp of approval by an Office of the National Coordinator Authorized Testing and Certification Body (ONC-ATCB) program and is 2011/2012 compliant in accordance with the criteria adopted by the Secretary of Health and Human Services. The designation officially means that providers using ICS version 4.1 can qualify for funding under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA).

An Electronic Health Record system enables providers and their staffs to create, use, edit, exchange, store and retrieve patient records. ICS is an episode of care based EMR/EHR with a fully integrated PACS, RIS, e-prescribing, billing, scheduling and progressive practice management suite. All inputs are updated in real time and communication both within a clinical practice and among colleagues is effective and efficient.

"This certification validates that our software can help providers leverage their expertise to not only make significant care improvements and enhance the patient experience but to also improve the business aspect of their practice in many ways which include achieving meaningful use and qualifying for incentive funds under ARRA," says Carla Miraldi, President of National Medical Imaging, LLC.

The Drummond Group's Electronic Health Records (ONC-ATCB) 2011/2012 certification program tests and certifies that EHRs meet the meaningful use criteria for either eligible provider or hospital technology. In turn healthcare providers using the EHR systems of certified vendors are qualified to receive federal stimulus monies upon demonstrating meaningful use of technology – a key component of the federal government's push to improve clinical care delivery through the adoption of effective use of EHRs by U.S. healthcare providers. ICS version 4.1 met the requirements for ambulatory care modular certification.
